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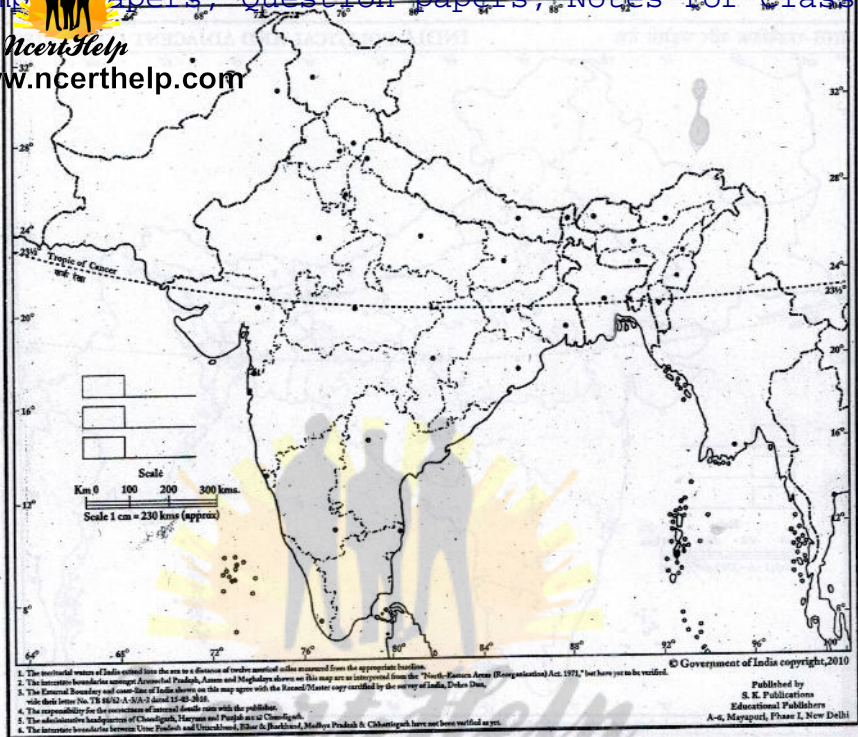

6. The international boundaries between Uttar Pradesh and Orissa and Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh & Chhattisgarh have not been verified as yet.

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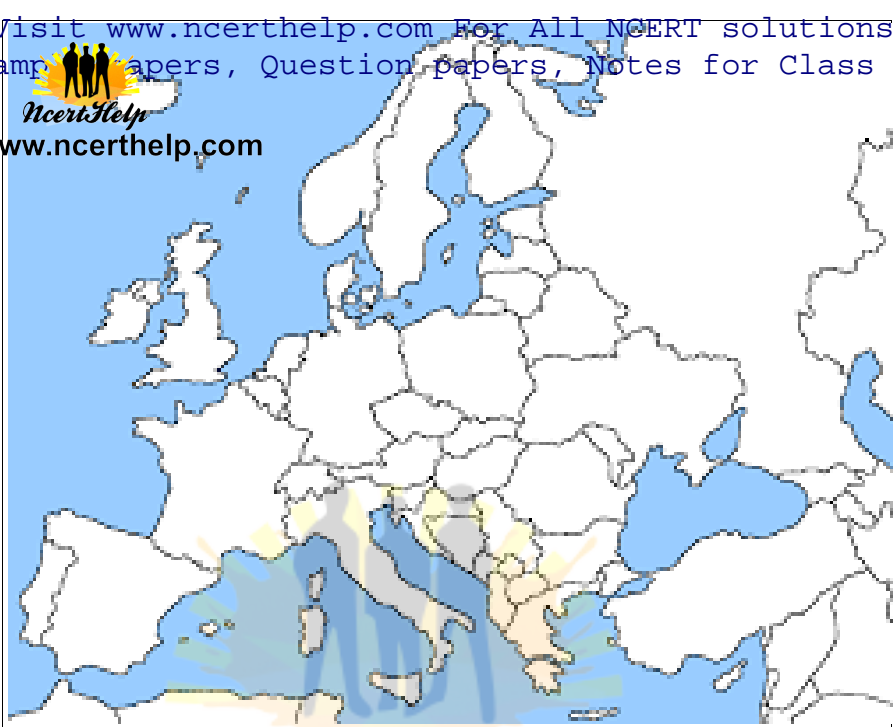
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
